After just recording at Festival in Sydney the line up was bound to be strong including new song 'Mr Pina Colada' proving popular. The National winning track 'Unco' was requested from the crowd, then followed by another track off their EP, 'In Your Room'. Sure to be the ultimate groupie song with girls swooning over Wells singing, "when I lie in your room". The guys definitely have the looks and charisma to attract the fans. Then there's the music... chatting around the bar a regular asked the predictable question, "so is this the next Silverchair?" Maybe.
